MEN'S GOLF

LEAGUE PLAY

Men's League starts Wednesday, April 19

CGA INTERCLUB

The Carolinas Interclub is a team competition that uses each player's twelve month Low Handicap Index to create an even playing field. Both leagues will play four-ball match play formats (no singles matches). Points are awarded for each match and the team earning the most points wins the overall match. Men's Interclub Requirements Include:

- 12 Players
- Must have a minimum of 10 scores posted within the past 12 months
- All players play from approximately 6,000+ Yardage
- Must be 18 years of age or older

Men's Senior Interclub Requirements Include:

- 8 Players
- Must have a minimum of 10 scores posted within the past 12 months
- All players play from approximately 5,500 6,200
- Minimum age of 55 years of age or older
- An information meeting will be held on Wednesday, February 22 at 5:30pm.

MOST IMPROVED GOLFER AWARD

Based on your USGA Handicap starting May 1 until October 15.

HOLE-IN-ONE-CLUB

The Hole-In-One-Club is an optional club for members to join. Each time a Hole-in-One Club member receives an ace at Bentwinds all who are members of the HIO Club are billed \$5 and that member receives what is collected towards their account. Sign up is located in the Golf Shop. Hole-In-One must be witnessed to be eligible.

USGA HANDICAPS

To participate in certain Bentwinds tournaments members are required to establish a USGA Handicap. There is \$30.00 charge per member per year to establish a handicap. Handicap fees are charged to your monthly bill annual to the time you sign up. (Juniors 13 and under are not charged a fee for establishing an USGA handicap.)

HANDICAP INDEX

A "Handicap Index" is the USGA's service mark used to indicate a measurement of a player's potential ability on a course of standard playing difficulty. It is expressed as a number taken to one decimal place (e.g., 10.4) and is used for conversion to a Course Handicap.

EQUITABLE STROKE CONTROL

For handicap purposes, Equitable Stroke Control (ESC) is the downward adjustment of individual hole scores in order to make handicaps more representative of a player's potential ability. ESC sets a maximum number that a player can post on any hole depending on the player's *Course Handicap* from the tees played. ESC is used only when a player's actual or most likely score exceeds his maximum number based on the following table:

EOUITABLE STROKE CONTROL

Course Handicap	MAXIMUM NUMBER ON ANY HOLE	
9 or less	Double Bogey	
10 through 19	7	
20 through 29	8	
30 through 39	9	
40 or more	10	

COMPETING FROM DIFFERENT COURSE RATINGS

In accordance with the USGA, in tournaments or events where a net score is required, course handicaps are adjusted based off tee box being played.

When conditions of a competition reduces a player's Handicap Index, the Course Handicap is derived from the actual USGA Handicap Index for ESC purposes, rather than the reduced Index used for the competition.

SCORE POSTING

Scores are posted by the professional staff in all stroke play events where your own ball is being played. It is the player's responsibility to verify their hole by hole score following play. Scores should be adjusted using Equitable Stroke Control prior to posting into the GHIN system by the tournament software. In best ball events when holes are not completed the most likely score should be recorded.

WHEN TO TEE IT FORWARD

This chart is a guideline to help golfers align their average driving distance with the course length best suited to your abilities.

LOCAL RULES TO REMEMBER

TEMPORARY IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS: Greenside fans and irrigation boxes are deemed to be temporary immovable obstructions (TIO's). Line of sight relief is permissible only when taking relief from these obstructions.

IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS: If the bathroom or clubhouse interferes with your stance and/or swing in preparing for a normal shot, you may take your nearest point of relief dropping it within one club length, no closer to the hole. This DOES NOT include line of sight relief.

OBSTRUCTIONS: Stones in Bunkers are considered moveable obstructions. If your ball comes to rest on or near a stone in a bunker which could affect your golf shot or damage your golf club, you may remove the stones or lift your ball. If necessary remove the stones and replace the ball into its original position.

OUT OF BOUNDS: Out of Bounds is defined by the inside white edge of white stakes at ground level; by white lines tying into OB stakes; by the inside edge of the paved road left of #1, behind #12 green, left of hole #13. Internal Out of Bounds: while playing hole #13, the green, greenside bunkers, and fairway through the rough on hole #17 is out of bounds. While playing hole #14, the green, greenside bunkers, and fairway through the rough on hole #16 is out of bound. Internal Out of Bound is for the entire hole and not just the tee shot. The driving range is considered out of bounds while playing hole #10 and hole #18.
